
Getting Better? Annual Expenditures on Surface Transport

Government More of the Same

- Provide affordable housing in the periphery
 New! Tax incentives on new housing construction
- For jobs, then connect the periphery to Tel Aviv

Panel Recommendations Go Local

Local Activism


- Lack of transit: families of young children became families of teenagers
- New neighborhoods to double the city from 40,000 to 80,000 residents

Institutional Response

- New transit coordinator hired as city staff
- Extended the train schedule for evening service
- Transport master plan underway
